The school Twitter account also offers little snapshots into everyday life at school. At the end of the year, you receive your child's annual written report and we held an 'open classroom' after school to look at books. We are aiming to hold more of these next year. Some responses are individual issues and will be addressed separately. The statements listed here are more general.

A forest school or outdoor curriculum, although OPAL is trying to achieve something like this. We agree that the development of an outdoor curriculum is very important and we are lucky to have some wonderful grounds surrounding the school. OPAL is one aspect of this but part of our School Improvement Plan this year is concerned with developing our outdoor curriculum across all subjects not just lunch and playtimes. Hopefully you will start to hear about this soon from your children- starting with the outdoor leaning week this week!

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Possibly a greater range of extracurricular clubs.

Due to limitations with the hall, we can only have one club in there per afternoon so usually try to ensure each year group has one on offer. Over the school year we try to ensure there are a wide range of sports clubs available as well as other non-sporting clubs such as Mad Science, Pokémon, Eco Club, Warhammer and homework clubs. We will continue to review these to try and ensure there is something for everyone!

School traffic inconsiderate parking & crossing at Kings Brow

Like many schools, the traffic situation outside is a serious concern. It is particularly difficult on days when the weather is poorer. As you know, I have sent numerous newsletters remind parents about their responsibly to park and drive safely down this road and to park await from school where possible to ease congestion and make it safer for everyone. **Sadly, there are still a high number of parents who continue to ignore these requests and put the lives of children and their parents/carers at risk.** We have had visits from traffic enforcement officers but sadly, as there is a similar situation around most Wirral schools, they are unable to visit as frequently as we would like. The local council have also been unable to offer much in the way of support. There is a new scheme being put in place in Village Road which we have raised objections to as we feel it may also increase the traffic along Mill Road.

More 11 plus tuition/practice as this is an 11+ Local Authority.

The guidance from the Local Authority to schools is very clear that we should not be offering 11+ tuition or practice. The selective grammar school tests (11+) are optional tests for parents and cares who wish their children to attend the grammar school. They are not part of the statutory National Curriculum for England that the school has to teach and therefore we are unable to offer any tuition for these tests.

Could INSET days at HBJS and Town Lane Infant School be the same?

We know that having children in two separate schools can make things difficult on days such as INSET days. We do liaise as much a possible with Town Lane to try and make this easier. However, we are two separate schools with our own training needs and it is not always possible to have these on the same day. However, for the academic year 2023-2024 the majority of the dates are the same.

A way of helping parents who may need it with all the dress up days i.e. collecting costumes once families have finished with them so they can be re used as they only wear them once. We think this is an excellent idea. We will look at ways of organising this for the next academic

year. We would also like to look at pre-loved uniform as we are always approached by families who have spare uniform they would like to donate.
