Children will continue to learn about time.
Children will be taught to:

Fractions

count up and down in tenths.
recognise and use fractions as numbers.
add and subtract fractions e.g. $5/7 + 1/7 = 6/7$
compare and order fractions.
Finding equivalent fractions.

Statistics

draw and interpret data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.
answer questions about charts, graphs and tables.

Multiplication and Division

know multiplication and division facts for the 3,4 and 8 times tables.
use multiplication and division facts to solve problems.

Geometry: Properties of Shapes

know 2d and 3d shapes names and properties.
identify right angles and are greater or less than a right angle.
identify horizontal and vertical lines and pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines.
Measuring and calculating perimeter of a shape.

English

Reading

Along with regular reading at home, the children will participate in 2 hour-long guided reading sessions. This will help to develop their vocabulary and the breadth and depth of their reading, making sure that they become independent, fluent and enthusiastic readers who read widely and frequently. They will develop their understanding and enjoyment of stories, poetry, plays and non-fiction.

Vocabulary, grammar and punctuation

The children will be taught to:

- continue to add to their growing list of vocabulary;
- ensure accurate punctuation is used in writing;
- use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause;
- extend the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including: when, if, because, although;
- choose nouns or pronouns appropriately for clarity and cohesion and to avoid repetition;
- use the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense.

Spelling

The children will be taught:

- Suffixes
- Apostrophes from contractions
- 'I' sound
- 'ou' sound
- Homophones

And words from the Year 3/4 statutory spelling list.

Writing

The genres we will be looking at this term are poetry - both rhyming and free verse, instructions, , explanation texts, biographies, newspaper reports and persuasive letters. The children will be taught how to plan, draft and write their work. They will also be encouraged to assess the effectiveness of their own and others' writing to suggest improvements and check for spelling and punctuation errors.

Handwriting

Pupils will be taught the cursive style of writing. They will be encouraged to increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting.
