

Mathematics Overview

Children will be taught to:

Refine their knowledge of place value, working with numbers between 1 000 000 and 10 000 000.

Round and compare numbers to 10 000 000, followed by placing them in order from smallest to greatest.

Explore the 4 operations, in combination and in isolation.

Create and solve expressions involving brackets, exponents, multiplication, division, addition and subtraction.

Multiply 3- and 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers using number bonds and column multiplication as the key methods.

Simplify fractions; to recognise equivalence in fractions to 1 quarter.

Compare and order fractions by finding common denominators.

Add and subtract fractions of different denominators.

Multiply and divide fractions.

Divide 3- and 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers using a variety of methods, including number bonds and long division.

Solve more complex word problems involving multiple operations, including multiplication and division,

Read and write decimals using base ten materials before moving on to dividing and multiplying decimals by 1 -digit numbers with no regrouping or renaming.
