- Find totals and calculate change, using both £ and p.
- Estimate and read time.
- Use time vocabulary and time facts.
- Compare durations of events.
- Solve word problems for length, mass, volume, time and money.
- Use knowledge of place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division to solve measurement problems.

## RE

Children will be taught:

### Sikhism

## English

### Reading

Along with regular reading at home, the children will participate in daily guided reading sessions. This will help to develop their vocabulary and the breadth and depth of their reading, making sure that they become independent, fluent and enthusiastic readers who read widely and frequently. They will develop their understanding and enjoyment of stories, poetry, plays and non-fiction.



### Vocabulary, grammar and punctuation

The children will be taught to:

- continue to add to their growing list of vocabulary;
- ensure accurate punctuation is used in writing;
- use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause;
- extend the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including: when, if, because, although;
- choose nouns or pronouns appropriately for clarity and cohesion and to avoid repetition;
- use the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense.

### Spelling

The children will be tested weekly on spellings appropriate for their ability. They will continue to:

- use further prefixes and suffixes and understand how to add them
- spell further homophones
- spell words that are often misspelt
- use the first 2 or 3 letters of a word to check its spelling in a dictionary

### Writing

The genres we will be looking at this term are poetry, character and setting descriptions, instructions, diaries and stories. The children will be taught how to plan, draft and write their work. They will also be encouraged to assess the effectiveness of their own and others' writing to suggest improvements and check for spelling and punctuation errors.

### Handwriting

Pupils will be taught the cursive style of writing. They will be encouraged to increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting.
