

Mathematics Overview

This term, we shall be continuing to develop the children's basic mathematical skills in number, which will include both mental and written calculations across the four operations. These skills will be extended through a range of mathematical reasoning activities and topic based work.

Towards the end of the term, we will be looking at transition maths modules in readiness for the children starting Year 7 in September.



Religious Education

Choices: This topic will include biblical examples of temptation and making the correct choices.

Memories: The children will be exploring memories and what makes them, looking in particular at how they will remember their junior school days. They will also be thinking about the memories that we want others to have of us and the memorial that Jesus and other religious leaders have left.

P.E.

Athletics: The children will be focusing on developing their technical understanding of athletic activity. They will be learning to think about how to achieve the greatest possible speed, height, distance or accuracy in their athletic work, through a range of running, jumping and throwing activities.

Striking and Fielding: A range of striking and fielding activities will be taught, which are designed to help children develop skills, strategies and tactics in these games.

PSHE

The children will complete RSE work based around the theme of 'Changes' building on the work from the Year 5 RSE curriculum.

The children will also take part in 'Active Bodies/ Healthy Minds' workshops run by an accredited mental health worker alongside a PE coach to support positive mental health both in and outside of school.

English Overview



Reading

This term, reading skills will be developed through the children's work in their English lessons and through other curriculum subjects.

As always, they will continue to read a wide variety of texts including poetry, a range of modern and classic fiction stories and a range of non-fiction texts.

Writing



The summer term will provide opportunities for the children to write a wide range of texts, including letters, narrative settings, leaflets and non-fiction texts. They will use Macbeth and Romeo and Juliet as a stimulus for much of this work.

Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation:

Children will be:

- continuing to develop a wider range of sentence conjunctions.
- continuing to secure the use of a wide range of punctuation including brackets, commas, exclamation marks, question marks and the semi colon.

Spelling

The children will continue to investigate and be tested on a range of related spelling patterns.

Modern Foreign Languages: French

The children will be constructing sentences with increasing complexity through story texts.
